Shifting Gears: President's Perspective Stu Benson



The Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh has had many wonderful events with which to participate so far and the rest of this 'driving year' will be no different. Keep checking the Jaguar Jargon for such information as well as our jaguarclubofpittsburgh.org website. Please sign up (and get your friends to do so) for the Veteran's Show at the Southwest Veterans Center on Saturday, June 24; it is free for everyone and lunch is provided as we provide disabled veterans, and their helpers and caregivers, a time 10. Name Tag (bring your JCOP name tag to all JCOP to see cars that inevitably trigger many pleasant memories by all. It is one of the ways JCOP provides outreach opportunities for community service.

As I head out on the road, some time ago I started creating a written checklist of basic things to do or think about before leaving the house with any of my cars. I keep a couple duplicate checklists pinned to the wall of the garage so they are readily accessible, just like a pilot/ co-pilot going through a pre-takeoff check. I find the list is especially helpful when I am not taking my daily driver. I will share my current checklist and invite anyone with more ideas to let me know and we can update this list down the road (but it sure helps to have them already in the car since once one is "down the road" without them it can cause regret).

My current checklist includes:

- 1. Check tire pressures while tires are cold,
- 2. Check fluids (one checks the oil level once car is warmed up and then shut off; if you have a dry sump make sure to give enough time for the oil to return to be accurately read on the dipstick).
- 3. Sunglasses
- 4. Fire Extinguisher everyone should always carry a fire extinguisher compatible with automobiles. No, do not use a typical ABC extinguisher since it can wreak havoc on the metal in your engine and elsewhere. You want to use a fire extinguisher with Halotron (which, when released, actually is attracted to the fire; if there is an engine fire you can release the Halotron in the air opening to the engine without opening the hood and it will seek out the fire) or get an Element E50 Fire Extinguisher (which looks like a flare and which Jay Leno did a testimonial for that can be found on line).
- 5. Garage Door opener (if you have electric garage doors and are driving an older car without the ability

to program a button to send the opening signal frequency).

- Travel bag; it could include Personal care items (i.e. 6. toothbrush and toothpaste if going to eat, a hairbrush if driving with the top down, paper towels, soap, or whatever), a pen and pad of paper, etc.
- 7. Liquid refreshment in an auto-safe container.
- 8. Jumper cables or power jump starter.
- 9. Mobile Phone charging cord.
- events or even with other organizers).
- 11. Portable chair(s) if you are going somewhere where seating is likely desired and you do not know there is sufficient seating available.
- 12. Take your EZ Pass if there is even a remote possibility you will be using the PA Turnpike and its extensions anywhere, like driving home at the end of the drive.
- 13. During COVID protocols: take a mask or two; Jumper cables or power jump starter let's hope this is not needed soon again.
- 14. If you are on a cruise with other cars where they use walkie-talkies, take one or two of yours (or where if the others do not have any, you can loan one to the lead car or last car in line). Remember to charge the batteries the night before you leave.
- 15. Tool kit or bag: while basic tools and duct tape and belts and such are often needed when you don't have them with you, being prepared can save a lot of stranded folks if your fellow drivers do not have the necessary item with them. When I asked Jack Terrick what he takes with him when he drives his E-Type, he provided me with a website that is most instructive for all Jaguars since what you take can depend on what you are driving and how much you want to take with you for that trip. Further suggestions are welcome and I look forward to your sharing additional checklist items you may have for your automotive trips. Let's get out there and drive. And a little preparation and thought can go a long way, literally and figuratively.

Coventry Corner By Ken Como



"The times, they are a -changin"... (Bob Dylan)

The news leaked over the past weeks indicates Jaguar's line up of models will shrink dramatically over the next 2 years, as the manufacturer preps to be completely electric starting in 2025. Not only will the line up shrink, but the 395 dealerships in the US., will also decline, possibly to as low as 50. In our own area, Bobby Rahal has surrendered the Wexford dealership for Jaguar new car sales but will be keeping the South Hills location as their key Jaguar franchise in the Pittsburgh area. Sales and service will still be available in Wexford for used car sales and service for existing Jaguar customers, at least for the near future.

As the 2025 model year approaches, JLR will be phasing out the iconic F-Type as well and the smooth riding XF sedan in the steps to redefining the line, as move closer to the new generation of all electric Jaguars. Three new high-end vehicles are anticipated to be priced in the range of \$120,000 and up, with the goal to become a low volume high end luxury car manufacturer. At this point in time there have been no glimpses of the new line-up, although some of the dealers have seen some vague hints of what will be coming, but for the rest of us, we will have to be patient and wait until later this year before we know more! The 2024 model year will celebrate the 75 years of Jaguar's production of combustion engines, and the F-type R75 will be known as, "the last of the breed".

With that news in the forefront, it is even more important to support the success of the Coventry Foundation in their mission to protect and honor the heritage of the brand and to preserve history for future generations.

For those of you who may not be familiar with Coventry Foundation (formerly known as the Jaguar Foundation, up until 2016), the history goes back a little more than 11 years ago, to a small group of Jaguar owners who set out to preserve this history and driving experience of Jaguar cars. We have to thank, our own Gary Kincel along with George Camp of South Carolina, as the initiators of this brilliant idea. It came to light in a casual after-hours discussion between the two of them, during a national AGM/JCNA meeting. The goal was to start a foundation that would preserve the lifetime collections of cars, tools, and literature for future generations to enjoy and learn. Both gentlemen were JCNA leaders in their own rite, but this labor of love would be completely independent of JCNA and the Jaguar Corp., it would be a nonprofit entity unto its own, which would become an ever-important resource to our community as time goes on. *Continued on next page*

To do this endeavor correctly, both men knew it would be extremely valuable to form a 501-3c organization to foster charitable contributions from the community. As in many new adventures of this type, things some time start slowly, until the word and story begin to spread....and spread it did!

The first large donation to Coventry came in 2013 and was a sizeable collection of tools and display boards, valued at approx. 40k. This addition came from an independent collector in California who was looking to make a charitable gift. In 2014 a major collection of Jaguar artwork and factory materials was received. However, the first significant donation came in 2016, it was a beautiful 1956 XK140 fixed head coupe, from Cecil Myers in the South Carolina area. Things were now really beginning to pop in a positive way for the foundation and momentum was in play.

In the early years, George Camp's house became the first east coast collection destination. However, as cars were beginning to be donated and many other items started to arrive, it quickly became evident that the house was becoming filled to capacity, and that more space would soon be needed.

The next immediate step was to find a new larger storage location which would be able to accommodate the ever-growing inventory of tools, cars, and other donations. The search begins... *To be continued*...
