Noon	At approximately noon, or as soon as the scores are tabulated, the awards ceremony will start.

Shifting Gears: **President's Perspective** **Stu Benson**



The JCOP Concours d'Elegance is coming up on Saturday, September 16 at Fox Chapel Yacht Club. It has called to mind that many people are not sure of the correct pronunciation of the word "concours" and, indeed, what it really means.

"Concours" is a French word meaning "competition" and "elegance" in French equates to "elegance" in the English language. So the phrase technically and literally means "competition of elegance" or a public contest of beauty.

It is the word "concours" of which your author has heard numerous pronunciations. Doing some research on this has unearthed that there are no less than thirty-some ways to pronounce "concours". I am not going to bore you with such a lengthy list but do wish to share a number of observations.

Any one of you can Google "concours" and read, and hear, about people pronouncing the word. In French, different people give linguistically small different pronunciations but they sound like "con cur" or "konkur" or "kawn-koor" to me. I even heard one pronunciation that sounded like "con querd" to my ears.

According to what I read, the phrase crossed the English Channel to be used in England for automotive beauty contests and, of course, the term became Anglicized to sound to me like "kongkooz" in British English.

And then in American English, a somewhat different accent for the Anglicized version was pronounced as "kongkurz".

It seems that depending on where any given person is from with their native language, accent, local dialect and whatever, there will be some variant of many words when pronounced in any given location or by any given person. But given that Jaguars are, of course, English-manufactured vehicles it would seem that if the Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh has a Concours d'Elegance, it cannot be said to be incorrect to use the Anglicized pronunciation of "concours" just as it is technically correct to use the French pronunciation. And regarding Jaguar Clubs of North America, it would seem to be relevant where the club is located in terms of what dialect is prevalent in that part of the United States, let alone where the show would be in Canada (where both the English and French languages are spoken) or Mexico as to how they would pronounce "concours" at other locations.

Part of my interest in this arcane topic stemmed from reading a letter to the editor of Hemmings Classic Car magazine last year when I received my November, 2022 issue in the mail. A reader from Fort Collins, CO commented in his letter (letters are published under the heading of "Backfire") on a litany of what he felt were ten various pronunciations that "your English Teacher Failed to Tell You" and #3 on the list the author addressed was "Concours" where the writer said: "it is con-coo-er", no ess at the end. Any NOT "concore", "concores", or – God forbid - "concourse". The latter are in airports."

So as President of JCOP, I decree that no one should feel *compelled* to have to pronounce "concours" like the French do but it surely is correct to do so. But since we are having a Jaguar Concours d'Elegance, feel free to use a British English or American English pronunciation if you wish. I may well use them all.

What will be entirely correct is everyone coming to the Concours d'Elegance on September 16. Registration is now closed (See page 1 of this issue). Dave Gamret, the Immediate Past-President of JCOP, authored an excellent President's Column in the August, 2022 Jaguar Jargon as to the many reasons to register for the Concours given that there are three classes of entries and learning the "ins and outs" about your Jaguar is not only interesting but can help its value when you possess a judging report if and when you ever sell it. I would recommend you reading that article that is easily accessible on the JCOP website. Even if you just come and view the cars and then have a social lunch with everyone on the river at Fox Chapel Yacht Club following the Concours, it would be a wonderful social event. JCOP has over 200 vehicles in the club so let's get a record turnout this year with/without registrations.

Pete Galinowski is not going to be able to plan and lead a Fall Leaf Tour this year. If anyone wishes to do so, please let me know. John Putzier is going to plan a Sunday Brunch tour to Tara in Mercer County where we can take back roads and view Fall foliage. The tour is scheduled for Sunday, October 22, so we have that back-up in the works being planned. Stay tuned for details on that!

Aside from the variety of really neat cars that show up, the other really pleasing part of the day for me was seeing how much of a good time everyone was having, perusing the cars, catching up with friends, making connections, and more. I am always very delighted to see the many passersby, have such a good time moving about and really enjoy taking in all the cars. We've frequently said the following among board members, as well as to Sewickley Boro personnel, that putting on the show is not only for our people, but very much for the enjoyment and curiosity of the community at large. Aside from getting "eye-stains" all over the cars, the pleasure of the visitors at large, is actually our real purpose, and quite simply, "what its all about". And no, it was not troubled with being "crowded", but rather pleasantly circulating with a gentle flow of people with great curiosity. It was all one could ask for.

We had a great selection of cars to see. Quite a selection of 9 Ferraris, and there was quite a battle for People's Choice "Best Ferrari", with a tie between Marc Buzzelli's 1978 512 Berlinetta Boxer, and Daniel Vidal's 2002 360 Spyder. There was also quite a selection of Jaguars of many vintages, as well as Rolls Royce/ Bentleys, plus lots of other marques. Best of Show was a terrifically interesting 1925 Rolls Royce Silver Ghost, "Pell Mall" body style. This was an open car, and was quite a crowd pleaser.

The owner, Dave Campbell, was very gracious and invited people, especially kids, to have seat behind the wheel while their Mom/ Dad could take their picture. Dave also brought a 2019 RR Silver Ghost, and had intended to bring a 1912 RR Silver Ghost, “Roi De Belges” body Style, but alas it was tied up in New England and could not come at the last minute. With it, I was hoping we would set a new, “Oldest car” record at the show this year. The 1925 came close, but was a runner up to the 1920 Ford Model A that Terri Dakan (then Hohmann), brought a few years ago. So for now the record stands, but I am assured that Dave will be bringing the 1912 next year in 2024 ... so don't miss it! We'll be breaking quite a difficult record to beat. Some of the other particular notables was the 1946 Bentley, shown by Deb Davis, took Best RR/ Bentley, and quite a notable car indeed. Charlie Roberts brought his 1973 Jaguar E-Type Roadster, and won Best Jaguar. We hadn't seen it at Sewickley in a few years, so he brought it (just for a change, instead of the Maserati Ghibli last year), and did very well. “Best of USA” was won by Terri Dakan with her the very notable 1960 Corvette Convertible, and “Best in Class” (i.e., All Other Marques) was won by Jos Kleynjans 2009 Mercedes McClaren SLR. That one is a very special car, in that it is the very last one the factory made, and indeed a very impressive car to see. All of these cars mentioned, were very impressive examples, and each garnered quite a respectable number of votes for the People's Choice awards (also summarized in the table on the next page). All that being said, there still was a very impressive display of all the cars, certainly none to be missed seeing.

Every year of this show, words of “everyone have a great time” are used. And while those words can seem to get over-used, the good part is how true it was again this year, as it typically always is. There was no shortage of enjoyment, good lunch food choices, smiles everywhere, kids and adults ogling cars while often having their pictures taken with the cars, (adults too !), ... plus much more than I could begin to mention. Not the least of which, plenty of places to hide from the sun if you wanted to. Passersby did enjoy participating in the Peoples Choice voting, and were very interested in hearing the results at the awards presentation. They very much enjoyed looking on and talking with owners. For me as chairman, I just can't convey how much of a thrill it was for me to see all of you, and the random passersby, smiling, talking, and just having such a relaxing good time. It makes it all worthwhile. Though the weather had us hold our breath a bit, I will still venture to say we couldn't have asked for a better day, or a better crowd. So I very much say to ALL of you, participants, visitors, and passersby alike, Many thanks!

Many thanks to Sewickley Council, and also to the Boro Manager, Donna Kaib, Sherry Clarke (Admin Assistant and Treasurer), Sewickley Public Works, and Sewickley Police, for their efforts in making site usage so seamless.

Many of the participants shared with me how much they appreciated the various email messages I sent out leading up to the show, i.e., as I tried to manage “around mother nature.” I appreciated all the kind words you shared with me, and I say “your welcome” (always!). I'm glad it made a difference, and was pleased to have the chance to stay in touch.

We plan to put the show on again next year, in the same time spot next August, so somewhere around late June or so in 2024, be on the lookout for announcements of registrations being open. Once again, thanks to all, and looking fwd to seeing you again, and all your great cars, next year in 2024 ! Va-rooom !!!

The trip takes 4 to 4.5 hours from the Cleveland area, so plan to leave in time to make it to the museum by Noon.

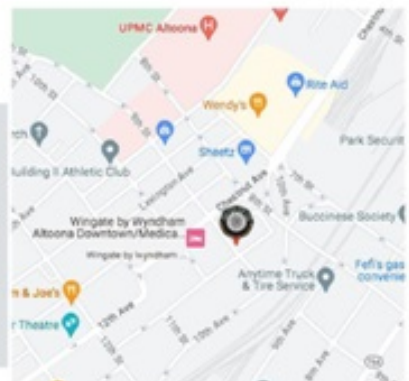
