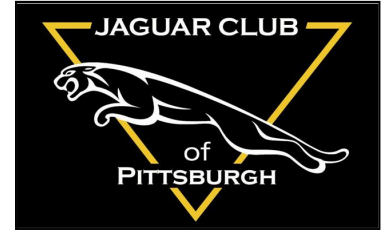

The Jaguar Club of Pittsburgh's 2022 Concours was held at the scenic Fox Chapel Yacht Club on Saturday, September 17th. The show site was the result of Mike Tarquinio's and MAXMotive's generosity. The custom-designed glass trophies were made possible due to our exclusive sponsor, Jaguar Monroeville, formerly A&L Jaguar.

This year's show field consisted of 21 judged Jaguars and several display cars. Several cars were shown for the first time, including JCOP member Paul Read's 1960 Mk 2 Saloon in Grey. It has been several years since we had a Mk 2 at the show. A pair of two F-Types were also new to our show. JCOP members Tom and Cindy Book showed their 2019 F-Type Coupe in Grey with a rare manual transmission. Jaguar Club of Ohio's James Valentine's 2016 F-Type Coupe was another first-time car but he was not a new participant to our show. His car is painted in Fire Sand (Orange/Red), one of my personal favorite colors.

Stuart Benson (JCOP) left his 1968 Red E-Type OTS at home in favor of his 2013 XJL Saloon in British Racing Green. I am confident that Stu can be awarded a North Central Region or even a North American award if he attends two or three shows in 2023. Linda Como (JCOP) showed her 1992 XJS Convertible in Black and received a first-place trophy.

Three additional E-Types showed in the Champion Division; Pat Geary (JCO) (in photo at bottom right) drove down from Erie in his 1969 Red 2+2 and judged, JCOP president Dave Gamret showed his 1967 Black FHC and Jim Cordock of the Jaguar Club of Southern New England showed his 1970 Black OTS.



JCO's Dominic Perri showed his 2013 XF sedan in white and judged while his wife Irene helped with the scoring. Another JCO couple, John and Kathy Schindler, performed double duty, John judging and Kathy score keeping. The third member of the score keeping team was JCOP's Richard Galinowski who also did an excellent job as Master of Ceremonies at the awards presentation.

Anyone that watched the solemn and respectful funeral procession for Queen Elizabeth II on September 19 surely noticed the unique vehicle that carried the coffin of the UK's longest serving monarch to the queen's final resting place in St. George's Chapel at Windsor Castle, where she was laid to rest next to her husband of more than 70 years, Prince Philip.

It was reported that the state hearse was designed by Jaguar Land Rover and The Royal Household, and the Queen was consulted on and approved its design. The vehicle featured her personal royal cypher and was designed to allow members of the public to have a clear view of her coffin as it traveled to her final resting place.

The Queen was 96 years old and reigned for 70 years before her death on Sept. 8.
