New Slate of Officers and Board Members to Lead JCOP in 2021


Congratulations to JCOP members that have been elected to new positions for the coming year.





KNOCKOFF SPINNER TOOL

Tired of beating up your spinners with that copper and rawhide mallet or splintering that wooden attachment to remove and install your knockoffs? Now there's a new tool available that can do the job without damage. Take a look at the flyer below and photo of the tool installed on my car. Check out the website listed for complete information. I've used it a few times and it works really well. You will need a 250 ft.lb. torque wrench that registers in both directions to install the spinners and preferably a large breaker bar to remove them. I found the process much simpler than pounding with the hammer and it eliminates the risk of damage to your car by the errant hammer blow.
